

Claude (Dov) B. Stuczynski is an Assistant Professor at the Department of General History (Bar-Ilan University). Having written a number of contributions in various languages (books: *The New Christians in Portugal in the 20th century* in Hebrew and in French, *"Between Religion and Religiosity. Converso Judaizers of Braganca and the Inquisition of Coimbra in the 16th century"*; *"In Defense of the Nation: Portuguese Converso Apologetics in the 17th century"*, forthcoming and *"Conquistadores' Consciousness, Fray Bartolome de Las Casas and his Defense of the Amerindians"*, forthcoming in Hebrew), his two main fields of research are: the Converso phenomenon - mainly in Portugal- and Early Modern encounters between Europeans and non Europeans- mainly Amerindians. He is interested in the relationship between religion and politics in Medieval and Early Modern periods. Actually he prepares a study of the theological-political dimension of the Converso phenomenon (what he calls: "The Marrano Paulinian Moment"). last year he taught at Tel-Aviv University and is a current board member of the Center for the Study of Conversions within Abrahamic Religions at Ben-Gurion University, Beer-Sheva .
