#### **Course Description**

#### 0 Credit Points, Required Course

In this course, students will learn the rules of English grammar and practice academic communication skills through writing. Together we will learn about sentence structures, parts of speech, possession, tenses, types of sentences (simple, compound, complex), and the rules of punctuation, and apply these topics on short writing assignments about various subjects. We will also work on our verbal expression skills by practicing our abilities to present clear, persuasive, and grammatically correct arguments.

#### Requirements and Grades

#### The course's final grade is PASS/FAIL.

Throughout the semester, students will submit 8 short writing assignments, which will receive either a PASS or NP (No Pass) grade. To pass the course, students must pass at least 6 out of 8 assignments.

Instructions for every assignment are posted on the course's Moodle site and explained in class. Assignments must be submitted on Moodle and <u>on time</u>, because the submission boxes close automatically on the exact time they are due. If for any reason you cannot submit an assignment on time, contact me in advance.

**Attendance is mandatory.** You may miss a total of 2 lessons throughout the semester, including the registration period (or, תקופת השינויים).
