# Research Project: Why Occupy? Why not? Comparing Political Processes after 2011 revolts: Tunisia, Egypt, Chile and Israel

The research seeks to comprehend the tension between the symbolic framing of the wave of 2011 mass protests as "occupy social movements" and the disappointing political processes provoked by the physical occupation of public squares. In order to do so the research will explore different local political contexts and analyze the political dynamics in cases that used the occupation of public squares compared to those cases that didn't use it. I'll compare four cases characterized by their success gaining massive public support and mobilizing unprecedented demonstrations in the streets: Tunisia, Egypt, Chile and Israel. These cases underwent divergent political processes after the peak moment of protest: two reactive responses closing political spaces to the popular demands (Egypt and Israel), and two pro-active processes of democratic opening of political spaces of representation (Tunisia and Chile).

The question is why the most successful political processes after the moment of protest occurred in cases that didn't use the occupation of central public squares as main tool of mobilization? The hypothesis is that the occupation of public squares was used as a tool of mobilization and coordination in cases with a weak and divided civil society. In these cases the protest movements were unable to continue a coordinated struggle after the dismantlement of the encampments, and failed to influence the political process. Following initial findings the research will investigate the mutual relations between civil society organizations and political parties, before, during and after the moment of protest.

The intention of the research is to make a contribution to theories of democratization and social movements. Both theoretical traditions analyze political processes of change, but their concepts and research have a shared weakness: the theoretical difficulty to explain political processes that led to disappointing outcomes from the point of view of the social actors. In both literatures there is a tendency to build models with multiple factors, however, such attempts tend to end up providing complex terminologies which can be used to describe all processes while leaving little explanatory power. I suggest here a simple testable theoretical framework accounting for dynamic political processes of change.

Political processes are dynamic, they may open or close political spaces of recognition, representation and mediation between autonomous civil society and state institutions. After mass mobilization of civil society the success or failure of political processes depends on the autonomy and power of civil society, the capacity to articulate interests and cooperate with political actors. Political actors might be re-active to social movements because mass mobilizations threaten to empower competing political actors representing new groups, identities, agendas and demands. This distinction is necessary to comprehend the different dynamics after the "moment of madness" in each case; this is not an ideological distinction between "left" and "right", rather a matter of power interests, between those defending their power and those seeking empowerment.
