



CALL FOR APPLICATIONS FOR SUMMER 2023 RESEARCH FELLOWSHIPS

This is a call for a summer scholarship for outstanding graduate and postgraduate students from institutions of higher education in Israel or abroad who have enrolled in a degree granting MA, MSc or PhD program in the 2023-2024 academic year at Ben Gurion University of the Negev (BGU) and have arranged to do their thesis under the supervision of a member of the School of Brain and Cognitive Sciences in the fields relevant to the school.

The scholarship will enable recipients to begin their firsthand research experience in the summer months before their studies commence. Recipients will be required to engage in research activity in the lab of their thesis supervisor during the three months of scholarship support.

Recipients will be selected from among candidates meeting the application criteria according to established academic excellence and according to the relevance of their planned research to the fields of brain and cognitive sciences. The number of scholarships is limited.

The Master's Degree Fellowship awards NIS 2,808/month from July to September 2023

The Doctoral Degree Fellowship awards NIS 3,696/month from July to September 2023

These amounts include matching funds from the supervisor to which they must commit as part of the application process.

Scholarship applications must be received by Wednesday, June 1, 2023 at 04:00 p.m. Applications received after this date but before June 30, 2023 will be reviewed based on resource availability.

Applications for summer fellowships must be submitted through the [Registration Form portal](#) where the information and accompanying documents required are specified in full. Applications missing information or any required accompanying documents will not be processed.

Conditions for applying for candidacy:

1. Admission to a master's or doctoral degree program in one of BGU's relevant departments in the 2024 academic year. Students admitted for a doctoral degree may apply, provided they are not BGU scholarship recipients in Semester II of 2023 (i.e. double scholarships will not be granted).
2. Agreement of one of the members of the School of Brain and Cognitive Sciences to supervise the student's thesis.

Accepting the scholarship is taken as a commitment to a thesis under the supervision of the the summer research, as well as a commitment to submit a report on the progress of the summer research at the end of the scholarship period.
