

Postdoctoral position at INSEAD in 2022-23

The INSEAD-Israel Fund invites applicants for a postdoctoral position at INSEAD. Applicants should have completed their Ph.D. in psychology, business administration or in related fields. The position will commence in the academic year of 2022-23, with an option to extend based on progress. The postdoctoral fellow will be affiliated with INSEAD and work on research on such topics as creativity and adaptive learning.

The Fund will prioritize Israeli candidates with proven experience in experimental and field research (e.g., designing experiments and surveys, data collection in the field, knowledge in advanced statistics, excellent writing skills). We are seeking ambitious candidates, who aspire to pursue an academic career in leading institutions. The postdoctoral fellow can be based in France, Singapore or Israel and will be occasionally be asked to travel across sites.

While the focus of this position will be research activities, the postdoc is expected to actively contribute to the activities of the INSEAD-Israel fund and related workshops and events. No teaching is required.
