

The School of Psychological Science at the University of Bristol is seeking to appoint a 2-year Senior Research Associate/ Research Associate (£34,304 - £43,434, depending on experience) to join the decision neuroscience lab of Dr Konstantinos Tsetsos (<https://www.ktsetsoslab.net>) at the University of Bristol. The position is part of the research grant INFOSAMPLE ("Information Sampling in Multiattribute Choice") funded by an ERC (European Research Council) Starting grant awarded to Dr. Konstantinos Tsetsos.

The successful applicant will be involved in designing and conducting behavioural experiments, and in analysing behavioural and eye-tracking data using advanced statistical and computational methods. Capacity to engage with neural data analysis (E/MEG) is desirable but not essential.

Applicants must have a PhD (awarded or imminent) in Psychology, Statistics, Computer Science, Cognitive Science, Economics, Neuroscience, or any other relevant subject. They must be able to demonstrate research interest and expertise in human decision-making and in other topic areas related to the project (e.g. visual attention, perception, computational modelling). Good programming and quantitative skills are necessary and previous exposure to eye-tracking methodologies is desirable.
