In this course, we will discuss the ways in which Case-marking interacts with the semantics of a sentence. These phenomena reveal that the choice of Case can be sensitive to such factors as specificity, definiteness, existential presupposition, animacy, aspect, etc. We will discuss semantic as well as syntactic analyses of Case alternations and attempt to determine whether or not these analyses provide a satisfactory account of the interaction between form and meaning. The phenomena that we will consider include, but are not limited to, dative alternation, differential object marking, spatial case, predicate case, partitive case in Finnic and its relation to aspect, etc.
