Nonfinite adjunct clauses sometimes display Obligatory Control (*The sofa folds out to form a bed*) and sometimes Non-Obligatory Control (*Another day has passed without hearing her voice*). What does this distinction depend on? The meaning of the adjunct? Its structural position? Is there a competition between the two readings? In this seminar we explore these and related questions, and develop linguistically-informed ways of classifying controlled adjuncts. We will show how the notions of selection, predication, and logophoricity shed light on the complex behavior of adjuncts under control.
