Course Description

THIS FIRST-YEAR WRITING COURSE WILL TEACH YOU WRITING FOR ACADEMIC PURPOSES.

It is aimed at teaching you to write analytical essays. During the first and into the second semester, we will continue onto literary analysis.

IN THE FIRST SEMESTER MAINLY, YOU WILL LEARN THE BASIC RULES AND PRINCIPLES OF ACADEMIC WRITING. THESE ARE CRUCIAL FOR YOUR ACADEMIC SUCCESS.

THE SECOND SEMESTER WILL FOCUS ON LONGER LITERARY ANALYSIS PAPERS SPECIFICALLY WRITTEN FOR INTRODUCTION TO PROSE FICTION AND RELEVANT TO ALL WORK IN THE DEPARTMENT.

BECAUSE CLASS WILL BE ONLINE AND BECAUSE IT IS AN ACTIVE WORKSHOP, BEING PRESENT DURING CLASS TIME IS OF UTMOST IMPORTANCE.

YOU DO NEED ACTIVE CAMERAS MOST OF THE TIME (THOUGH YOU MAY NOT NEED THEM ALL THE TIME).

PARTICIPATION WILL BE MEASURED BY:

- ENTERING THE ZOOM MEETING ON TIME,
- HAVING THE CAMERA ON WHEN NEEDED,
- SUBMITTING ON TIME BOTH CLASS WORK AND HOMEWORK (SHARED GOOGLE DOCS, ASSIGNMENTS ON MOODLE, AND SUCH).

THE CLASS IS PASS/FAIL.

EACH ASSIGNMENT OR TASK RECEIVES A PASS OR FAIL.

YOU NEED 75% OF YOUR WORK DONE WELL TO PASS THE YEAR

IMPORTANT NOTE ON HOW THE SEMESTER WILL WORK:

The goal is for everyone to get a chance to be heard and read (this is a writing class)

FOR THAT PURPOSE, YOU WILL EACH BE ASSIGNED ONE OF OUR WONDERFUL TAS.

THE GOAL IS:

1. Ensure you have at least one TA who gets to know your writing needs.

2. Ensure that you are not alone even during these crazy Zoom days.

That TA will be your main contact for any issues and any help you need.

NOTE: ALL TAS WILL BE AVAILABLE FOR OFFICE HOURS. IF YOU WANT TO HEAR A DIFFERENT OPINION ABOUT WORK YOU ARE DOING, OR IF YOUR ASSIGNED TA IS NOT AVAILABLE, OR FOR ANY OTHER REASON - FEEL FREE TO SIGN UP FOR ANOTHER TAS OFFICE HOURS.

Dr. Rabkin is also always available for Zoom meetings or through email on any subject!

That means you have a variety of people who are there for you!

YOUR JOB IS TO BE PRESENT -- TALK TO US, EMAIL US, ASK QUESTIONS! AND YES, WE PAY ATTENTION AND MAKE NOTES TO SEE WHO IS ACTIVE.

IMPORTANT ADDITIONAL NOTES: ALL FINAL DECISIONS ABOUT YOUR GRADE ON ANY GIVEN ASSIGNMENT AND IN THE CLASS WILL BE DETERMINED BY PRIEL, TAL, AND FINALLY BY DR. RABKIN.

YOU WILL BE ASKED TO LEAVE NOTES/ANNOTATIONS ON PERUSAL (WILL BE EXPLAINED IN CLASS) ☐ SHORT, NON-FORMAL ASSIGNMENTS IN DIFFERENT FORMS -- ON SHARED GOOGLE DOCUMENTS, 2-3 PARAGRAPH JOURNAL RESPONSES ON MOODLE, AND SUCH--☐ SOME WILL BE INFORMAL, OTHERS WILL BE FORMAL. THEY CAN BE SHORT, FREE-WRITING ASSIGNMENTS WHERE YOU SHARE YOUR THOUGHTS ON BOTH WHAT YOU ARE READING IN INTRODUCTION TO PROSE AND ON ISSUES WE TALK ABOUT IN CLASS. THEY CAN BE FORMAL, WITH VERY SPECIFIC INSTRUCTIONS AND GOALS. ☐ IN ADDITION, THESE ASSIGNMENTS MIGHT ASK YOU TO PRACTICE SKILLS WE LEARNED SUCH AS WRITING PARAGRAPHS, SHORT STATEMENTS, CITATIONS, AND MORE. ☐ SHORT GRAMMAR, ENGLISH USAGE, AND RHETORICAL EXERCISES-- THESE ARE THE TYPES OF EXERCISES THAT ARE BOTH QUICK AND HELP IMPROVE YOUR WRITING ALMOST IMMEDIATELY. One to Two, 2-3 page essays specifically for Workshop about the materials we LEARN TOGETHER IN WORKSHOP.

If you put the proper amount of effort into this course, your writing and analytic skills will improve. Remember that we will see and strive for progress, not perfection.

How do I know during the semester how I am doing? How do I know my progress?

Your grades are based on your Electronic Portfolio -

Grades on assignments will be as follows:

Grade-	meaning	What to do
PASS	You passed with full points for this blog.	Read the notes left by the TA! There may be none or very few in this case. Move on to the next assignment. You are doing well.
PASS-	You have passed with almost full points.	Read the notes left by the TA and pay attention to what needs improvement for the next assignment. No need to rewrite other than paying attention as you move to the next assignment.
RW	Rewrite - means you have not passed the assignment	Read the notes left by the TA carefully. You will need to rewrite the Blog if you wish to pass it. Good news: you do have a chance to rewrite. Make sure to contact the TA or Orit (email or

		ask for a Zoom meeting) to make sure you understand exactly what needs to be done
Perusal- (interactive to leave notes on readings)	The program will show you the number of points you have on a particular assignment	What to do
	Full points	You are doing very well. The comments and questions you leave are thorough and help you understand the material.
	Repeated partial points	Leave more notes. They can be questions or comments such as what confused you or what did not make sense in what you read. It can be what you enjoyed or what it reminds you of. Talk to Dr. Rabkin or a TA
Shared Class Google Docs	meaning	What to do
	To be used during class in small group meetings	Same as Blogs see Blogs above- Remember that often you will be allowed to continue work on these at home. Make sure to finish the work by the deadline.

If you ever feel like you need to catch up with what is going on, open moodle and go to the "Announcements" - all emails sent with all instructions will be waiting for you there.
