## **Course Description & Objectives:**

The course is devoted to syntax, the branch of linguistics that deals with the way in which words combine to form phrases and phrases combine to form sentences. We will be considering basic syntactic concepts such as lexical and phrasal categories, constituent structure, tree diagrams, structural ambiguity, subcategorization frames, and phrase structure rules. We will also discuss subjects vs. objects, syntactic movement, binding, and control. While most of the course will deal with English data, we will also be making comparisons with your native languages.
