Course Description: Clinical exposure in Medical Rehabilitation

Aims of the module: To acquire theoretical basis and clinical knowledge in different fields of medical rehabilitation

<u>Objectives of the module</u>: To enable students to recognize the functional needs of the patient after different injuries and illnesses, to understand the general principles of functional assessment and definition of rehabilitation potencial, to define the primary rehabilitation program in different fields of rehabilitation medicine.

<u>Learning outcomes of the module</u>: On successful completion of the course, the student should be able to:

- Know and understand the general principles of rehabilitation medicine and disability management.
- 2. Diagnose the basic functional needs of different groups of patients.
- 3. Identify the general rehabilitation potential after different injuries and illnesses.
- 4. Create a basic primary rehabilitation multidisciplinary program in different fields of medical rehabilitation.
