Course Description: Basic clerkship in clinical gastroenterology

Aims of the module: To teach major topics in clinical gastroenterology

Objectives of the module: To provide basic knowledge and skills in clinical gastroenterology, with an emphasis on inpatient care.

Learning outcomes of the module: On successful completion of the course, the student will be able to:

1. Recognize and diagnose the main gastrointestinal syndromes
2. Recognize and have basic knowledge in the major gastrointestinal endoscopic pathologies
3. Identify and manage common gastrointestinal and liver diseases
4. Appropriately use imaging modalities in gastroenterology
5. Define ways of preventing gastroenterology malignancies

Teaching arrangement and method of instruction:

**Bedside teaching:** Students will have supervised rounds, will see and present patients and will be exposed to variant histopathological and imaging in gastrointestinal and liver topics.

**Frontal teaching:** Short seminars (one hour) about major gastrointestinal and liver diseases.
