

Ilanit Gavious is an Associate Professor of Accounting and Finance at the Guilford Glazer Faculty of Business and Management, Ben-Gurion University of the Negev, and a visiting Professor at ESSEC Business School, France. She serves as the Head of the MBA Program of Ben-Gurion University in Eilat. She is also a Certified Public Accountant (1996) and a commissioner of the Israel Securities Authority (the Israeli Securities and Exchange Commission) (2016).

Her current research interests are focused on three core issues: (1) Earnings management and accounting frauds in various settings (e.g., prior to bankruptcy and reorganization plans; in tax reporting versus financial reporting); (2) Valuation of intangibles (e.g., human capital); (3) The evolution of financial disclosure and accounting recognition of intangible assets by high-technology firms. Her work has been published in leading academic journals of finance and accounting. Recently, she won the Toronto Prize for Research Excellence (2011). She also raised research grants from various foundations including the CICA / CAAA Research Grant Program, the Social Sciences and Humanities Research Council (SSHRC), The Joseph Kasierer Institute for Research in Accounting and from The Marc Rich Foundation for the Promotion of Female Researchers.

Dr. Gavious teaches a variety of courses in Accounting and Finance. These include Firm Valuation (for MBA), Mergers & Acquisitions- Accounting and Financial Aspects (for MBA), Financial Statement Analysis (for MBA), Empirical Seminar: Measurement of Management Performance and Earnings Management (for MBA), Introduction to Finance (for MBA, M.Sc and B.Sc), Introduction to Financial Accounting (for MBA, M.Sc and B.Sc), Introduction to Managerial Accounting (for MBA, M.Sc and B.Sc).

In the past, Dr. Gavious served as Senior Accountant in a Big-4 accounting firm (Deloitte & Touche) and in a leading commercial bank in Israel (Bank Hapoalim). As a Lieutenant in the Israeli army, she held an academic position as an economist in the Ministry of Defense. She has a B.A. degree from The Hebrew University in Jerusalem in Economics (cum laude) and Accounting (1991) and a Master's (cum laude) (2002) and PhD degrees (2005) in Finance both from Ben-Gurion University. For her post-doc, she was a visiting scholar at Rotman School of Management, University of Toronto, Canada. She was honored by the Dean of the Faculty of Business and Management at Ben-Gurion University for achievements during thesis composition and received Dean's Excellence Prize (2000), as well as a Ph.D. Scholarship (2001- 2004).
