- Age 10: Experimented with play writing and music
- Age 15: Graduated from Gymnasium

- Born: September 1 1895 Kharkov
- Joseph Moiseivich Schillinger
- Mother: Anna nee Gielgur
- Father: Moses Schillinger
- Prosperous upper middle-class business people
- Grandparents: immigrated to Russia from Alsace Lorraine, Holland

Young Adulthood

- 1914: Completed formal education at Classical College (age 19)
- 1914+: Studied at St. Petersburg Imperial Conservatory of Music
- 1914-1918: Majored in composition under Kalafati, Chernoff, Cherepnin, and Wihtol
- 1918+: Majored in conducting under Cherapni

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- 1918: Senior Instructor of composition, Kharkoff Conservatory (age 23)
- 1918-1922: Head of Music Department Board of Education (Ukraine), and Consultant of the State Opera



- Mastered physics, acoustics, and electrical engineering
- Studied design, music, drama, art, and dance history

By Mid Twenties (age 25)

- Fluent in Hebrew, Latin, German, French, English, and Italian languages
- Exposed to classical and oriental philosophy and religious systems
- Studied mathematics under Koltovski and Anton Prizieborgski
- Studied versification with Nicholai Schebouver

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Late-twenties / 1920-1922

- 1920-1922: Professor and Dean of the Faculty of Composition Department at the State Academy of Music, Kharkoff Conservatory, Ukraine.
- 1920-1922: Conductor of the United Student's Symphonic Orchestra and Ukraine Symphony



1920-1922: Consultant to the USSR Board of Education

1922: Lecturer of Composition at the State Institute of Musical Education

1922-1926: Consultant to Leningrad Board of Education

1926-1928: Vice President of the of the International Society for Contemporary Music, Leningrad-branch (later called the Leningrad Association for Modern Music)


Early-thirties / 1925-1928

- 1925-1928: Professor and member of State Institute of the History (Science) of the Arts at St. Petersburg. [also called Institute of Musical Science in Moscow]
- ca 1925: Married Olga a Russian actress
- 1926: Lecturer at the State Central Musical Technium

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Major Commission

• 1927: Commissioned by the State Institute of the History of Arts to record (i.e., phonograph) the folk music of Georgian tribes in Caucasus. Previously these Khevsouri, Mokhevi, Mtiouleti, and Ajara tribes were unknown to ethnomusicologists



Schillinger's Piano Music


- Piano compositions were often featured on programs along with Stravinsky,

Symphonic Rhapsody

- Symphonic Rhapsody ("October") chosen by the Soviet State Committee on Symphonic and Chamber music as the best work composed during the first ten years of Soviet Russia's existence.
- Symphonic Rhapsody competed against "Red Poppy" by Gliere "Symphony No. 1" by Shostakovich

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
• Schillinger and Beethoven were the only two composers to appear in a special program which commemorated the 10th anniversary of the Soviet Union. 


Camaraderie

Vladamir Horowitz agreed








All That Jazz

- 1927-1928: Organized, Lectured, and directed the first Russian jazz orchestra
- Pre-KGB viewed Schillinger as defender of [American] Jazz, and hence, potentially dangerous to the state
- Schillinger was harshly interrogated on several occasions

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Ambassador of Music

- 1928: Chairman of Committee For Contemporary Music (State Institute of the History of Arts)
- Authorized representative of Leningrad Association of Modern Music to Western Europe and America
- 1928-1932: Member of the Composers Society in Berlin Germany


International Exposure

- 1928. Invited to America as a lecturer on contemporary music
- Host: Philosopher-educator John Dewey
- Sponsored by American Society for Cultural Relations with Russia (Music Committee: Joseph Achron, Kurt Schindler, Leopold Stokowski, Sergei Radamsky, and Edgar Varese)

Early American Activities 1928-1931: Collaborated with Russian inventor Leon Theremin on musico-scientific problems and the construction of musical instruments












1929: Founded New York Musicological Society with Henry Cowell, Joseph Yasser, Otto Kinkeldey, and Charles Seeger (later became American Musicological Society, American Society for Comparative Musicology)

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Schillinger Studio


- Schillinger's studio was equipped for the investigation of sound and music; to ascertain facts about music and to test musical procedures.
- The studio housed conventional musical instruments, as well as a Hammond electric organ, a sound recording system by MP Concert Installations, a rhythmicon, an oscillograph, and other acoustical and optical instruments.

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Immigration to USA

1930: Visitors visa to USA expired. Went to Canada in April. Re-entered USA with intention of becoming a citizen of the USA

1938 Frances Rosenfeld Singer


- Former cover-girl








 In 1938 after an intense six weeks romance Joseph married Frances in a private ceremony in City Hall, New York City





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In 1941 Frances asked Joseph write a series of popular songs in Tin Pan Alley style for her as a birthday present. Frances wrote the titles:

- 1. Of All My Loves a Tchaikovsky-like song
- 2. You're The Last on My List for Love a Torch song
- 3. I'm Through with Love a Blues song
- 4. Get Together and Dance a Latin-American song

Frances wanted these to be published; Joseph claimed they were show tunes that a student of his might someday incorporate into a Broadway musical.



Schillinger felt that it would not be fitting that he publish the songs under his name. Even Jascha Heifetz wrote a pop tune called 'When you make love to me' under a pseudonym Jim Hoyle.


The songs were copyrighted under the name FRANK LYNN


- -Frank is the masculine of Frances
- -Lynn is the first syllable of Frances' mother's name
- -Frank-Lynn is the first letter of FDR (the American president Joseph most admired)

In her book of memoirs, Frances claimed that only a few people knew about the four popular songs.
