This paper argues that cognitive maps are plausibly non-conceptual mental states. It provides some of the relevant history of navigation science, and it critically evaluates extant arguments that cognitive maps are non-conceptual. It then elaborates two empirically-based arguments: the argument from robustness, and the argument from flux. The former is directed at those who endorse the content view of the conceptual/non-conceptual content distinction. The latter can also be accepted by those who endorse the state view but deny the content view.
