Welcome to the 5th International Conference on Drylands, Deserts and Desertification

The International Conference on Drylands, Deserts and Desertification (DDD) has emerged as an important global gathering of scientists, practioners, industry, government, CSOs, international development aid agencies and other stakeholders from over 60 countries concerned about land degradation in the drylands, and their sustainable use and development.

The program combines plenary lectures and panels, parallel sessions, workshops, field trips and social events, providing an opportunity to consider a range of theoretical and practical issues associated with combating desertification and living sustainably in the drylands.a

The 5th DDD conference will focus on *Healthy Lands - Healthy People* and will consider natural and anthropogenic processes, and the interactions between drylands and people in and around them. Additional sessions will be held considering a broad range of topics associated with sustainable living in the drylands and means to address desertification, as well as land-based adaptation to climate change.

In addition to the free buses, Metropoline buses stop in Midreshet Ben-Gurion (where the Sede Boqer Campus is located) and travel both to Beer-Sheva (northbound, stopping at Mashabim on the way) and to Mitzpe Ramon (southbound). The trip costs roughly 15 shekels (less than 4 dollars). For more details, please approach the registration desk. Taxis are not available on site but can be ordered for you (at least a few hours in advance by the conference staff).

Internet Connection & Computer Services

Wireless connection is available in the Evens Auditorium and lobby area and in the conference café area, using a code as detailed herein.

There will be a printer available in this main hall, for your convenience. Unfortunately, there is no wireless connection in the accommodation area.

Optional early-morning activity:

On some days there is an optional early-morning activity that is open to participants, at no extra cost. The activities vary depending on your accommodation. In order to ensure participation, you should register by 5 pm of the preceding day with the local conference representative. Please approach the registration/information desk for more details and for registration.

Accommodation and keys to your room:

Most conference participants will lodge at the Field School and the University Guest House. If you have not yet checked-in, and have questions about the check-in process, please approach the conference representative at the registration/information desk.

Please note that regular check-in time is at 2 pm and regular check-out time is by 10 am. Therefore, please make sure on the morning of your departure, to take your belongings with you and properly check out of your hostel/ guest house. Limited storage facilities are available in the vicinity of the conference venues and there will be a conference vehicle available to take luggage from the accommodation area to the conference halls at about 8:30 each morning. Please coordinate with the organizers at the registration/information desk.

Supplies, Banking and Shopping

The "commercial center" of Midreshet Ben-Gurion (where the Sede Boqer Campus is located) has a supermarket (with an indoor cash withdrawal option), post office (with some limited banking options) and some shops. Please check at the registration desk for more details.
